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1. Background

AEMO utilises a central system called Market Settlement and Transfer Solution (MSATS) to manage consumer transfers. MSATS also administers notifications of transactions to market participants and retains the data needed to facilitate wholesale settlement. The MSATS Procedures have been in operation since 1 January 2002 and have been revised a number of times to support ongoing business improvements.

The recommended process improvements under consultation will become MSATS Procedures:

- Consumer Administration and Transfer Solution (CATS) Procedure Principles and Obligations Version 3.9,
- Procedure for the Management of Wholesale, Interconnector, Generator and Sample (WIGS) NMIs Version 3.9.

Scope of Changes

The proposed changes under consultation have been developed as a result of a request from the Tasmanian Government and relate to:

QC 853 – MSATS CHANGE FOR TASMANIAN FRC

This change will provide a mechanism to enable churn restrictions for small residential sites within Tasmania.

Within the initial months of Full Retailer Contestability, it is the intention of the Tasmanian Government to limit the number of transfers in the initial months to allow end-consumers the opportunity to adapt to the change in market conditions. The proposed changes will be temporary until such time that the Tasmanian Government determines that the market has settled in line with the reforms, and will initiate the removal of these changes accordingly. The Tasmanian Government has indicated that this transitional period will last no more than 12 months.

This document lists the proposed changes to the CATS Procedure, WIGS Procedure and associated MSATS configuration rules (if any).

2. Purpose of this document

This document proposes changes to the MSATS Procedures. AEMO issued the Final Determination for the most recent consultation on12 August 2013 for *MSATS Procedures: CATS Procedure Version 3.8* and *WIGS Procedures Version 3.8*. These changes are due to take effect as of 13 November 2013. The consultation is available on AEMO's website.

Participants are requested to review the item/s under consultation and provide any comments in accordance with the National Electricity Rules consultation process, reflected in the Notice of Consultation issued by AEMO.
